This Time Tomorrow

At St. Peter's we are trying to close the gap between the world of work, where most people spend much of their time, and the faith that guides the way they live. Here is the fifth in a series of articles that reveals what members of our congregation will be doing this time tomorrow; how their faith relates to their work and the challenges they face day by day...



Hello, and welcome to this edition of This Time Tomorrow. I am blessed with the gift of being a Private Hire Vehicle Driver based under the controlling authority of Harrogate Borough Council. Every day, I thank God for having been given this opportunity. Eight years ago, I suffered a broken and dislocated femur in a cycling accident which resulted in a number of major

operations in three different hospitals, three years off work, five years on crutches and considerable hardship for my family. However, we were continually blessed and the Holy Spirit supported us through the care and kindness of our family in Christ, many of whom may be reading this article.

Some familiar words from the Sunday Morning 9:30 Family Communion Service are: *Everything comes from You, and of Your own do we give You*. Perhaps the immediate connexion made from this phrase is with money, but it is so good to metaphorically stand back and see the greater picture. The Bible tells us that God created us in his own image (Genesis 1:26); quite literally, everything comes from God. Therefore, if we share God's love we can be a body for the Holy Spirit to work through.

During my working day, passengers will sometimes talk about 'church' and that can be the spark for an uplifting conversation. But usually what can make a difference to our day is being open, encouraging and caring with people – and remembering to give God the glory.






Food parcels are available from 4:45 pm every day, except for Sundays, when it's 5:30 pm.

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission. What did Jesus really say? A live lecture by the Revd Dr Alan Garrow



For the past century most scholars have suspected the existence of a very early set of sayings of Jesus, used in the creation of Matthew's and Luke's Gospels, that they commonly refer to as Q. If Q existed it should provide an even more accurate account of what Jesus said, and what the first Christians believed about him, than the Gospels do. This could be significant because Q, as commonly understood, doesn't include an account of Jesus' death or resurrection. But does the Q theory rest on a firm foundation? In this live lecture, on Saturday 17th March 9:30 am - 12.00 pm at St Mark's Leeds Road (a change from the advertised programme), Alan will show that the traditional

view of Q rests on two simple logical errors. When these errors are corrected the standard Q theory collapses; previously overlooked pre-Gospel sayings of Jesus come to light; and Luke's Gospel emerges as a particular source of insight into 'what Jesus really said'. 
