This Time Tomorrow

At St Peter's we are trying to close the gap between the world of work, where most people spend much of their time, and the faith that guides the way they live. Here is the next in a series of articles that reveals what members of our congregation will be doing this time tomorrow; how their faith relates to their work and the challenges they face day by day...

I'm Clare (pictured here with my son George) and I have been a nurse for nearly thirty years. For the past eighteen I've been a sister in Intensive Care at St James's Hospital, Leeds. Jimmy's, as it is known, is one of the leading and largest teaching hospitals in

Europe.

The hospital is situated in a diverse and deprived multicultural area with lots of socio/economic issues. This has a direct impact on the patient's health and the problems we treat. The life expectancy of people in this area is a decade less than in Harrogate! Intensive Care is a specialised area where patients have severe life threatening illness or injuries. The work is demanding and staff stress, sickness and burnout is high.

My approach to nursing and management of staff is driven by my Christian faith. It is challenged and called upon daily and without this I feel I wouldn't have the physical and mental strength to do my job.



Situations where my faith or belief is called upon and challenged include:

- caring for people involved in tragic and traumatic circumstances
- seeing suffering, grief and death on a daily basis
- making very difficult decisions on how to use the resources available
- being shocked and saddened by peoples' lifestyle choices
- being involved in withdrawal of life support.

Responsibility for patient, family and staff is at the centre of our decision making. I love my job and feel my Christian faith and values are always in my heart to guide me in my work.

Sunday Lunch Club Meets Today!




