# A Time for Refreshment, Renewal and Research



Having served on the clergy team at St Peter's in various capacities since June 2002, the Diocese has agreed that I may have a three month sabbatical; to include a modest research project which I hope will be of some use as it looks to the future. I will be away from the beginning of May until the end of July, returning in August to provide clergy cover until I retire on Sunday 16th September. I'm really grateful for this opportunity and it will certainly not all be

work. We have a family gathering in the Forest of Dean to celebrate Caroline's and my Golden Wedding Anniversary, which was actually back in January - but the weather will be better in July (won't it?). We are also planning a retreat week together to help us think and pray through what God's purposes might be for us as we embark on the retirement phase of life this autumn.

The research project that will be the centrepiece for my time away revolves around an aspect of the so called '2030 Vision' for the Diocese. This important initiative is designed to encourage all of us to consider how best to respond to the fact that up to 40% of paid clergy will be gone by 2030. Although new and younger people are coming on stream, there is no way they can fill that gap, so we all need to think about how to reshape the church and its leadership for the years to come, to continue to respond faithfully to God's call to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to every corner of our land. This challenge will be particularly acute in rural areas such as ours, where in many places clergy are already thin on the ground. Looked at another way, rather than being viewed as a threat, this is actually a great opportunity to develop lay leadership and handled well could herald an energising new springtime for the church. No doubt this will be a key theme at the significant Diocesan lay conference taking place this June in Harrogate.

My research during the summer will focus on how we can best deploy retired clergy in ways which will help, rather than hinder, the inevitable process of change, cultural as well as organisational, over the next decade or so. The head of the Church Army research department is providing an element of supervision. Apart from a certain amount of reading to familiarise myself with the issues, principles and practicalities, I hope to visit other dioceses to try to tease out best practice, and will also conduct a number face to face interviews in our area.

Your prayers for me, and also for Caroline, during our time away would be greatly appreciated. We trust it will be a time for refreshment and renewal combined with research that will help to make a difference.
