# 10 extraordinary days

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York are calling on Christians across the land to come together to pray for the people of our nation between Ascension and Pentecost ( $10^{th} - 20^{th}$  May). Locally, churches of many different denominations are responding to that call by sharing in an ambitious prayer project: to pray for every household in our town during that ten-day period. We are indebted to those who have organized the core logistics of this plan. Small batches of cards have been created and labelled with a particular part of a particular street in our Parish. These cards explain what we are doing and to provide an opportunity for the householder to request specific prayer if this is wanted. There is also a simple prayer resource for use while delivering these cards. This is the type of project where many hands don't just make light work – it's simply not possible without them!

When you attend Church during the period 10<sup>th</sup> - 20<sup>th</sup> May, may I invite you to take one or two of these small batches of cards to distribute prayerfully sometime before 20<sup>th</sup> May? There is untold need across every sector of our society. By this means we pray that every one of our neighbours will have the opportunity to be reminded of God's particular concern for them, and the commitment of local Christians, of every denomination, to work together to create a community where people are open to recognizing and responding to one another's needs: a community of compassion.

#### Volunteers wanted for new Wesley Welcome Café




#### St Peter's Ladies who Lunch
