Prayer for a home:

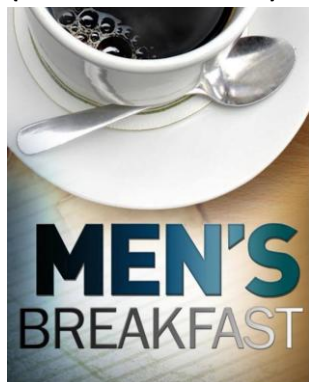
