St Peter's Breakfast Club receives £200 from ASDA

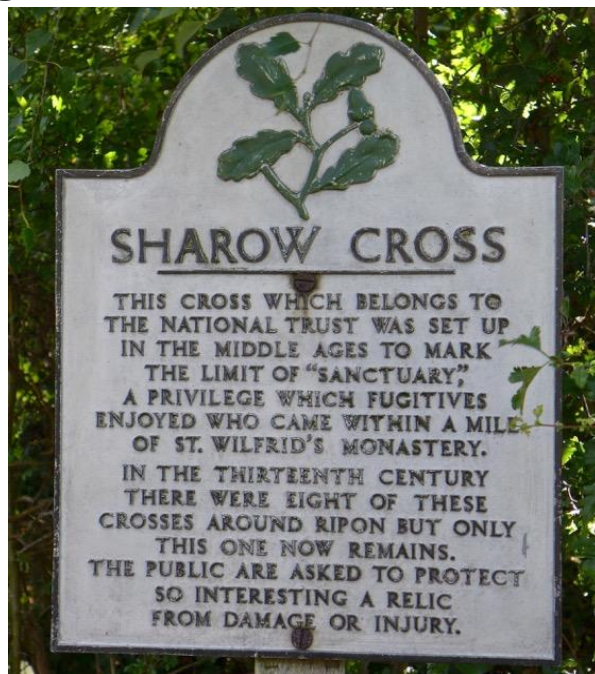

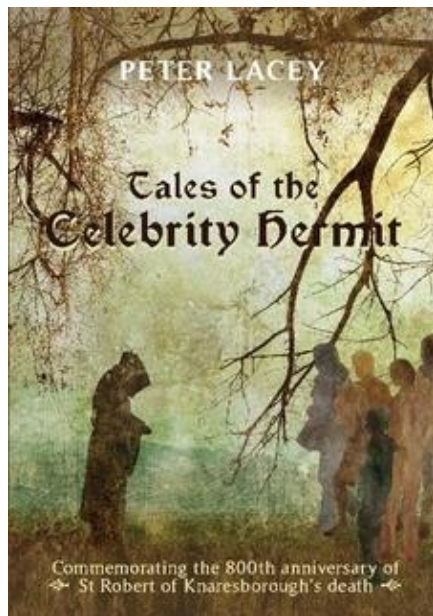

Historic Pentecost Confirmation Service at Kirkstall Abbey



An historic service took place at Kirkstall Abbey last week on 20th May, Pentecost Sunday. The Rt Revd Paul Slater presided at his first confirmation service as the Bishop of Kirkstall – within the ancient ruins of the Abbey itself. Last month, the Queen approved the change of title for the suffragan Bishop of Richmond, to better suit his role serving the Episcopal Area of Leeds.
