


And welcome Lunch...

In a new venture, the Revd Caitlin Carmichael-Davis, a curate at Ripon Cathedral, is leading three short pilgrimages this summer. The first, **Sanctuary**, is on Saturday 16th June and after meeting in the Quire of the Cathedral at 10:00 am, pilgrims will pause in the ancient Anglo Saxon crypt. The walk will then follow part of the Sanctuary Way to the Anglo Saxon sanctuary cross at Sharow. Originally one of eight markers, the cross marked the limits of the Sanctuary of Ripon, where fugitives could seek refuge. Then a short service of prayers and readings at St John's Church, Sharow, will reflect on the importance
