## Welcome Susie Hart of Craft Aid International

*Craft Aid International* gives people with disabilities (differently-able people) an opportunity to learn craft-based skills, and use these to serve differently-able people living in poverty in the developing world through social enterprise. The charity provides a fun and caring environment in which to learn new skills, interact with others, and work as part of a team towards a common goal. In the UK sessions are currently held in Leeds, Ripon and Harrogate, including therapeutic craft sessions at the NHS Lascelles Neurology Unit and on Oakdale Ward (for stroke patients) at Harrogate Hospital.

The charity is also establishing craft-based social enterprises in Peru and Ecuador, based on the *Neema Crafts Centre* in Tanzania, to provide training and employment for differently-able people, who would otherwise be living in poverty and social isolation. The aim is to change attitudes towards disability within the local community.

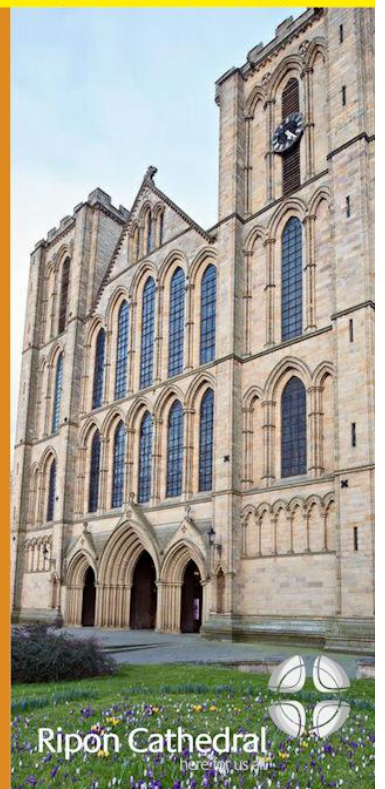
