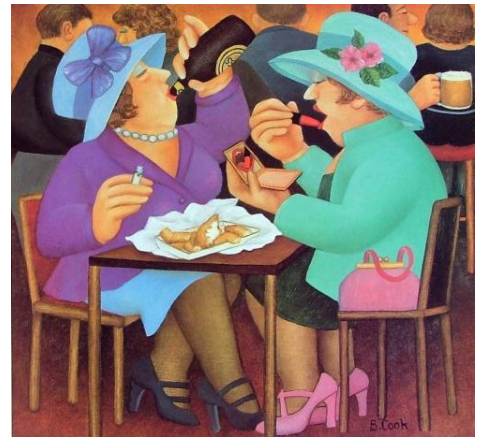
St Peter's Church welcomes G & S!

Almost 100 Canadian supporters and performers are flying all the way from British Columbia to perform *The Gondoliers*. 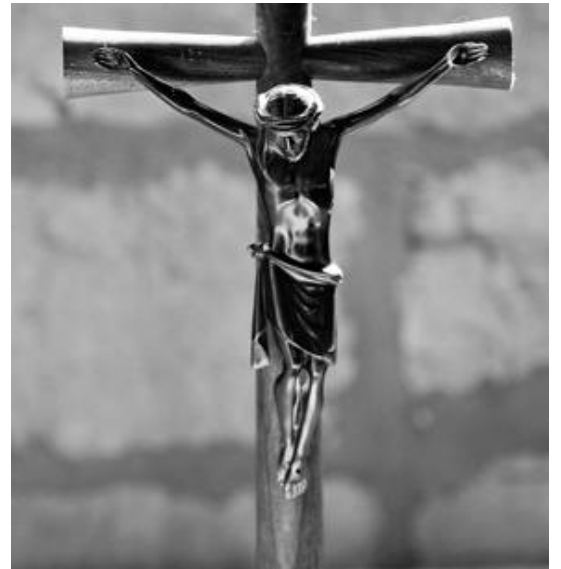

The Wilfrid Walks – Reconciliation and Contemplation

A curate at Ripon Cathedral, the Revd Caitlin Carmichael-Davis, is leading a series of day pilgrimages this summer. On Saturday **25th August**, the second walk, *Reconciliation*, will begin in the Cathedral's *Chapel of the Resurrection*. After walking to Markenfield Hall, the home of a Roman Catholic family during the Reformation, there will be a short prayer service in the Chapel there. Then on Saturday **8th September** the last walk, *Contemplation*, will be from Fountains Abbey West Gate through the countryside surrounding the Abbey: past Fountains Hall, through Spa Gill Wood and pausing at the beautiful Church of St Lawrence the Martyr in Aldfield.
