- join the annual *Great British Beach Clean* – there's an event at Robin's Hood Bay on 15th September, visit www.mcsuk.org/beachwatch

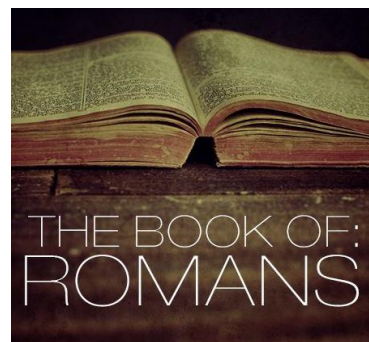
Farewell Lunch for Caroline and Tim Hurren next Sunday!

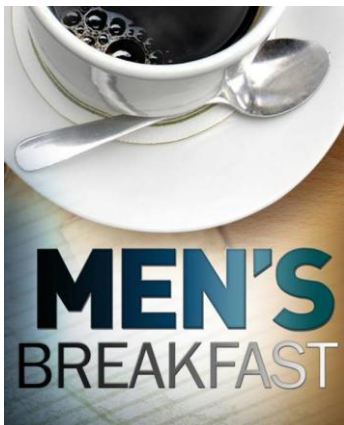

Dr Gavin D'Costa, Professor in Catholic Theology at Bristol University speaks on Christian-Jewish relations: new and difficult questions
