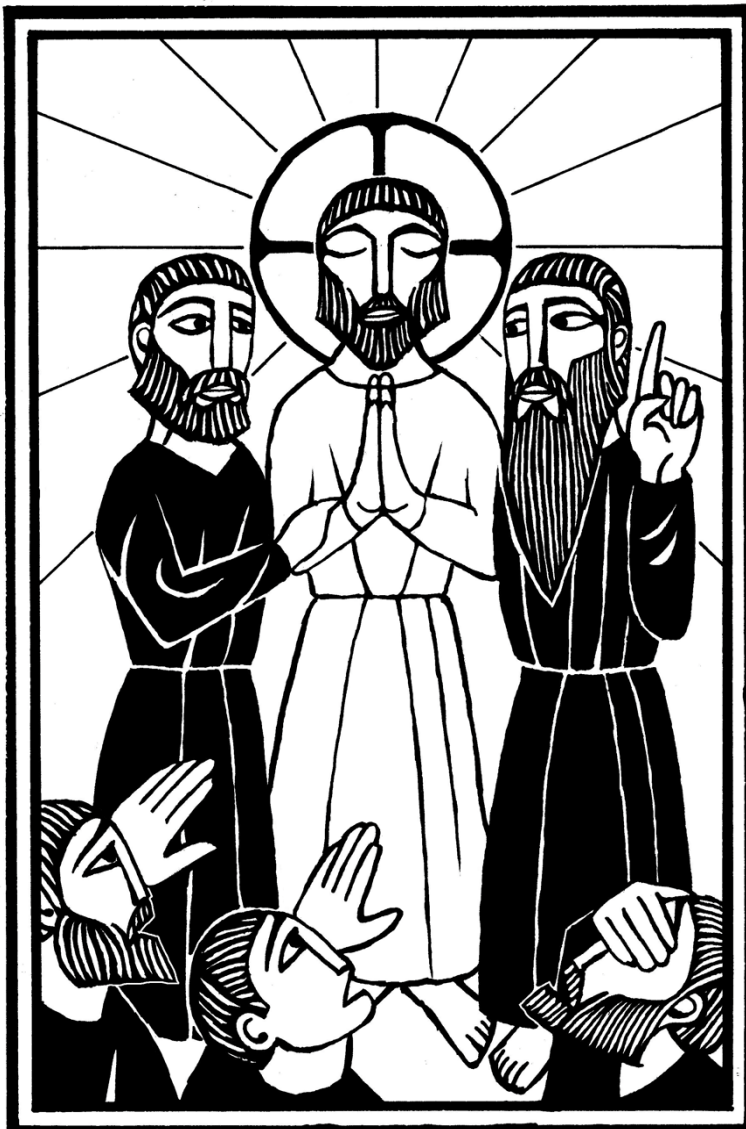

Today's Bible reading – Luke 9 v 28 – 36 - looks at the Transfiguration of Jesus and at the same time we will be experiencing a transfiguration of the 9:30 service, as the youth of St Peter's lead this time of worship.



Sanctuary have been preparing this service for the last couple of months, discussing the themes of the reading and how best to offer that to our worshipping community.

There will be some differences to the usual service as it will not be a communion service, but there are still strong connections to our traditional service. This offering is not a one-off show; but we hope it will be received as an authentic act of worship.

One of my own missions is to ensure our youth feel like this is their Church and that they can shape and develop our Church life. I feel we need to give them the tools and confidence to participate within our Church's worshipping life.

Our youth are the future leaders, workers, carers of St Peter's and we must continue to nourish and help

them grow - which may mean we have to allow for change.

So on behalf of **Sanctuary** we pray that you are able to worship freely and find God in this act of worship.

Fundraising Refreshment Day



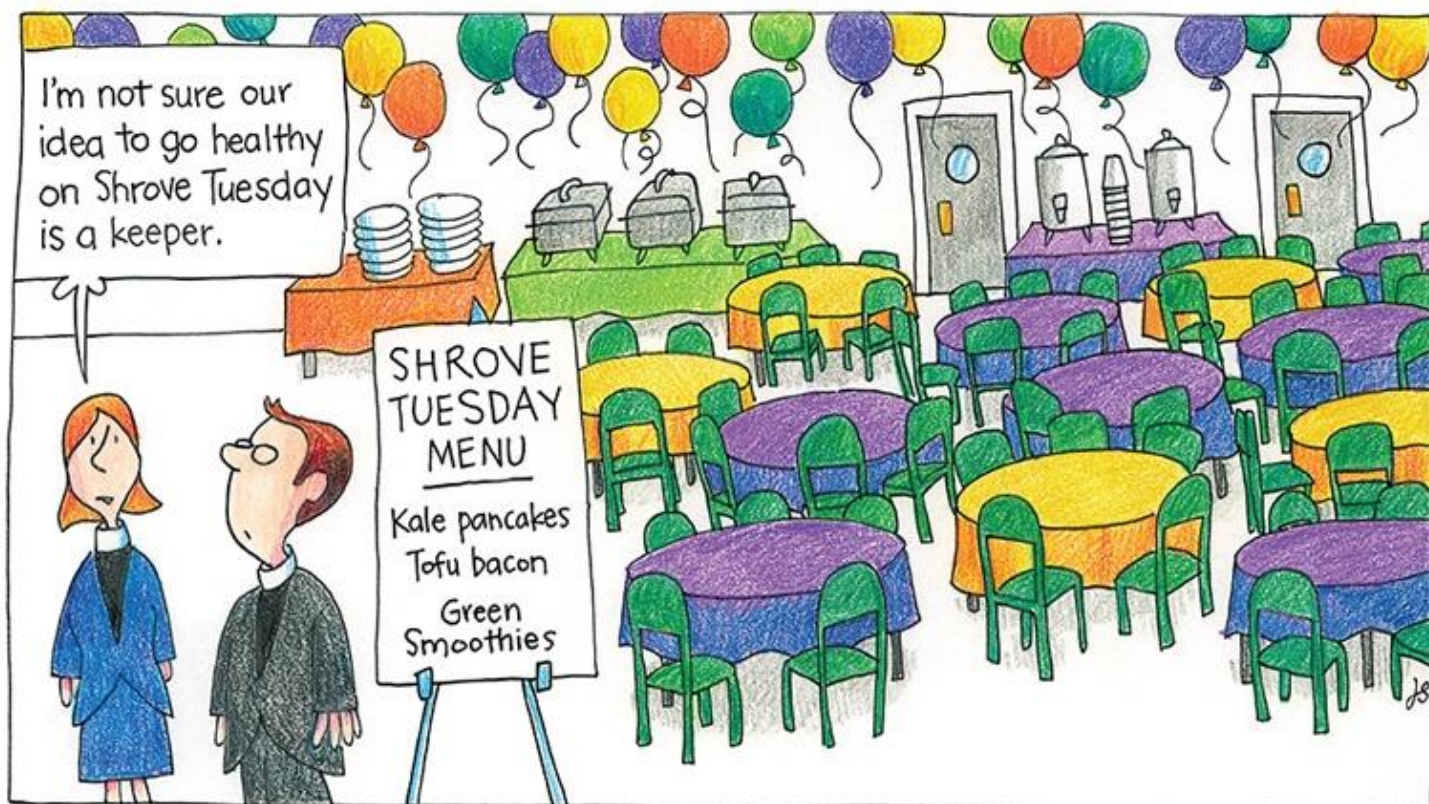

The Imposition of the Ashes

On Ash Wednesday, Roman Catholic, Anglican and some other churches hold special services at which worshippers are marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes. This service draws on the ancient Biblical traditions of covering one's head with ashes, wearing sackcloth and fasting as signs of repentance. As the minister makes the sign of the cross on each person's forehead these words are said:



Remember you are dust and unto dust you shall return.

Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ

Please come to the Communion Service with Imposition of the Ashes at 11:30 am on Ash Wednesday here at St Peter's as this season of Lent begins.

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission

The Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley – *To read, mark, learn and inwardly digest: some reflections on a diet of Biblical interpretation*
