Have you returned your Electoral Roll application form?




As Alan says every six years we have to renew our Electoral Roll and everyone needs to fill in a form this time. If you have not received an application form, then please ask one

of the Clergy, Carole Raw (Electoral Roll Officer), Paul Medforth (Churchwarden) or Patricia Stableford (Acting Churchwarden). The completed forms need to be returned to Church before 2nd April 2019, otherwise you will not be eligible to attend or to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 29th April 2019.

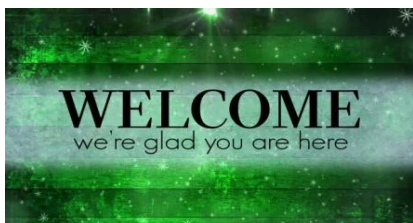

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission



The Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley – *To read, mark, learn and inwardly digest: some reflections on a diet of Biblical interpretation*

The Bible is the foundation of our faith, and we probably have our favourite bits, but what about the parts we don't understand, or don't agree with? If it's all the Word of God how do we navigate its terrain? In this lecture at St Mark's Church on Saturday 23rd March, Bishop Helen-Ann shares some of her own reflections on a number of

years pondering these questions. A continental breakfast is served from 9:30 am and then the lecture is from 10:00 am – 12:00 pm. Tickets cost £8 (students £5) which includes the breakfast and refreshments.

An End to Daily Prayers in Parliament?

Conservative MP Crispin Blunt is calling for the practice of saying prayers at the beginning of parliamentary business to be abolished. In the House of Commons, the prayer asks that MPs *'never lead the nation wrongly through love of power, desire to please, or unworthy ideals but laying aside all private interests and prejudices keep in mind their responsibility to seek to improve the condition of all'*.
