Feeding Hungry People: Purpose

What is the vision of St Peter's Church? How can we be a place that offers a true and faithful response to three basic human hungers: for belonging, purpose, and God himself? Last week we considered the fundamental human need to belong – and began to think about what it means to belong as a member in the Body of Christ. This week the focus is hunger for purpose. Surely there is more to life than mere survival ... until we die? Life is a precious gift, so it makes sense to expect that it might be 'for' something in particular.



Our Purpose

In Baptism we become members of the Body of Christ – which then gives a particular shape to our purpose: our purpose becomes the same as Jesus' purpose. This provokes questions such as: *How can we support and enable one another in living out that extraordinary calling in all aspects of life – in our homes, families, communities, workplaces, and Church life? Are there ways in which we need to develop and mature in faith, individually and together, so as better to fulfil that call? Might God be calling you, as an individual, to make changes in your life, or try something new, in response to that call? But, the question that underpins them all is: How may I belong to Christ truly in the first place?*


Help St Peter's garden to flourish

RIPON & THE DIOCESE JOINS THE GLOBAL WAVE OF PRAYER

At 3.30pm Bishop Nick will lead us in a short gathering before we are invited to explore pilgrimages and prayer stations inside and outside the cathedral.

After the very first Ascension Day the disciples gathered with Mary, the mother of our Lord, to pray while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. More and more worshipping communities have rediscovered the riches of this tradition and have dedicated the days between Ascension and Pentecost to pray 'Come Holy Spirit'.

In each diocese there is usually a large event within this period of prayer, and on June 2 Ripon Cathedral will host this for the Diocese of Leeds.

Following a short closing act of worship afternoon tea will be served.

The prayer stations will remain in the cathedral throughout the period of Thy Kingdom Come until we celebrate the feast of Pentecost on June 9.


A Thy Kingdom Come resource – Pray for five friends

Praying for others to know Jesus is one of the most powerful things we can do. Persistent prayer for others brings transformation to their lives. Choose five people you would like to pray for between Ascension and Pentecost (30th May to 9th June) and write their names down onto a list. If you're not sure who to pray for, ask God to guide you as you choose. Once you have settled on five names, commit to praying for them regularly by praying the following:

Loving Father, in the face of Jesus Christ your light and glory have blazed forth. Send your Holy Spirit that I may share with my friends [here, name your friends] the life of your Son and your love for all. Strengthen me as a witness to that love as I pledge to pray for them, for your name's sake. Amen.



Here is an easy way to remember to pray for your five friends regularly. Take a piece of leather or string and tie five knots in it to represent each of the five people you have committed to pray for. Wear it around your wrist or put it where you will see it daily. Use the knots to remind you to pray for each person on your list of five. There are some suggested prayers at: thykingdom.co.uk/praying-for-five-friends.
