The Work of Christmas begins

'The late Dr Howard Thurman was one of the quiet unsung heroes of history. An African American raised in the segregated South of the early twentieth century, he grew up with the indignity of racial separation and injustice. But like many others, he was profoundly influenced by a grandmother who believed in God, and who followed the way of love that Jesus taught and embodied. As a result young Thurman grew into an adult passionately committed to this way of Jesus. He became a noted preacher and teacher who founded a multiracial church in San Francisco before America had begun to learn the way of racial equality. He taught in seminaries and universities. His influence reached far and wide. Civil rights leaders consulted him quietly and regularly as the spiritual director of the movement. He is one of the people credited with helping Dr Martin Luther King grasp and embrace the teachings and methodology of Mahatma Gandhi. Dr Thurman's seminal book, *Jesus and the Disinherited*, was so influential for Dr King that he carried it wherever he travelled until the day he died.


A poem that Thurman composed focuses my imagination on the implications of the message of the birth of Jesus.
