Living Faithfully: Being Political

How can we be faithful in following Jesus in every aspect of our lives? This is the question addressed by John Pritchard's *Living Faithfully* – our Lent book for 2020. Taking inspiration from five of its chapters (there are twenty-one in all) our Lent Sunday morning sermons will consider: *Handling Money; Working Faithfully; Building Community; Going Shopping* and, this week, *Being Political*.

To 'be political' is about being willing to engage with the world beyond our own private corner. Do we care about how vulnerable people are treated? Do we want our young people to have a world that is worth growing up into? Do we have a vision for the kind of community we'd like to be part of? And, if we care about such questions, what does it mean to engage with them while 'living faithfully'?

The Imposition of the Ashes



On Ash Wednesday (and on the First Sunday of Lent), Roman Catholic, Anglican and some other churches hold special services at which worshippers are marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes. This service draws on the ancient Biblical traditions of covering one's head with ashes, wearing sackcloth and fasting as signs of repentance. As the minister makes the sign of the cross on each person's forehead these words are said:

Remember you are dust and unto dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ

The Imposition of Ashes will be available for those who wish it at our Communion services on Sunday morning as this season of Lent begins.
