## Holding on to Hope

We sometimes say, 'Where there's life there's hope!' but it's also the case that 'Where there's hope there's life!' Hope is a life necessity. We can't go on without it. So, in a context where everything seems to be shut down, it is vital to lift our attention to the hope that transcends human limitation.

On the first Easter morning the disciples were in a state of absolute despair. They knew, or thought they knew, how the story would play out for them from there onwards. And yet those expectations were utterly confounded. God's narrative of ultimate purpose and unquenchable love pierced and shattered their dismal expectations.

Wherever we are today, and whatever we imagine the future may hold, God has a story to tell that cannot be stopped, side-tracked

or derailed. Christ defeated death. That means that death is not the end of God's story – something else, something beyond what we can see or imagine, is the end of the story. When we hold onto that truth, we have an unconquerable cause for hope.

*'Death has been swallowed up in victory.'*

*'Where, O death, is your victory?'*

*'Where, O death, is your sting?'*

*The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.*

*Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labour is not in vain.*
