### A Lenten activity for children: PRAY, FAST, GIVE printable



Another idea from Katherine Bogner's website to use during Lent that ecourages children to pray, fast (sacrifice something) and give. It is simple to make using thin card or paper, some colouring pencils or felt tips and a stapler. First make a list of the ideas under three headings with your children. Here are some suggestions: Pray for Mummy and Daddy, Pray for Granny and Grandad, Pray for people who are sick. Fast from sweets, Fast from complaining (my personal favourite), Drink only water

today. **Give** a helping hand, Give others their turn first, Send a card to your friend. Then print out the base, decorate, fold and assemble it – <u>full instructions here</u>. Write your ideas on strips of paper and put them in the pockets ready to start on Ash Wednesday (the first day of Lent). Each morning the children pull out one suggestion from each pocket and try to fulfil their three challenges by the end of the day. We put the strips back as each challenge was achieved for someone else to try. Then the next morning they choose three new things. Try to keep going for the full 40 days!

### Will you be buying flowers for Valentine's Day next Sunday?

Thousands of roses will be flown into the UK and sold this Valentine's Day with many of them coming from many miles away – but should we feel bad about this? Fairtrade flowers are grown to the highest ethical and environmental standards. Fairtrade flower workers in countries such as Kenya, Tanzania, Sri Lanka and Ecuador receive an extra 10% for each stem sold. This is called the Fairtrade Premium and is spent on education, families, healthcare and communities. To find out more read 6 reasons why you should buy Fairtrade flowers.



If you are buying in a supermarket, the CO-OP sources 100% of its roses through Fairtrade; Aldi, ASDA, Lidl and M&S all stock Fairtrade flowers (but check for the logo). If you shop online, <u>Arena Flowers</u> are ranked as the UK's most ethical florist and <u>M&S</u> also sell a selection of Fairtrade bouquets for delivery.
