Never stop praying and serving



Lockdown no doubt asked some challenging questions for us as individuals; it certainly had that effect on us as a church. How can we be a place of worship if we can't gather in our building? How can we be a place of sanctuary if the doors remain locked? If the church can't continue a pattern of prayer and worship, if it can't be there for people in a crisis, then what on earth is it for?

As, at St Peter's, we asked ourselves these questions in March 2020 we identified two things we wanted to continue by whatever means possible. The first was a pattern of prayer and worship, online if not in person. (This has continued, see www.stpetersharrogate.org.uk, alongside the restoration, since July 2021, of our full pattern of in person worship.) The second was the continuation of our commitment to support people who are vulnerable. You can read on page two how our daily food ministry continued and grew - and still continues in an expanded form. And, with many other agencies across Harrogate, we discovered the resilience of our town's network of care.

This has been a bruising period for many of us, churches included. As we emerge to face the next set of challenges, we will continue to worship God and serve our neighbour. As St John says about Jesus:

The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it.

Feeding hungry people

St Peter's serves thousands of hot meals during lockdown



In March 2020 as the pandemic took hold and the country went into the first lockdown St Peter's Church building was closed and all our services moved online.

However, our food ministries - The Breakfast Club, Sunday Lunch and Food Parcels - were considered essential services and were exempt from the Government restrictions. Hannah Beck (pictured here with her deputy Steve, and two of the volunteers Yvonne and Courtney) not only continued but expanded this ministry and began serving hot,

takeaway food both in the morning and in the evenings too. This all started when Betty's Café was closed suddenly, and sent over all that day's beautifully prepared, fresh meals - but they had to be cooked and served hot that day! Other local businesses started to donate food, so the team of volunteers turned their donations into delicious, hot takeaway meals for all those who were hungry or in need. In that first lockdown alone over 4,000 takeaway meals were served from the West Door of our Church.

Now that the Church has re-opened, hot breakfast is served inside from Monday to Saturday from 8:20 - 8:45 am. A hot Sunday Lunch is served from 1:00 - 1:30 pm. And hot meals are available on Monday, Wednesday and Friday evenings from 4:00 - 5:00 pm. On Thursdays we hold a 'mini-supermarket' from 4:30 - 4:50 pm when bread, tinned and dried food, fruit and vegetables, toiletries and whatever else is available is given out.

All this relies on the tireless efforts of an incredibly hard-working team of volunteers to go shopping, collect and deliver produce, cook, pack, serve and keep the place clean and tidy. It also relies on the generosity and support of local businesses and our own congregation.

In April 2020 Finlay Cochrane, who comes to our Family Communion service, decided to complete his Personal Challenge Award at Scouts by organising a food collection in his neighbourhood for St Peter's Church. Finlay (*pictured right*) gave up his exercise time to leaflet 250 homes and collected the food using a wheelbarrow. As you can see the response was overwhelming with loads of donations and notes of support and encouragement left out for him.

Helen Harrison (on the left in the picture below) usually raises money for charity by walking the Isle of Man Parish Walk. For the past two years she has been unable to take part as it has been cancelled due to COVID-19. So in June 2020 she devised her own Parish Walk visiting churches in Harrogate and Knaresborough with a few friends to raise much-needed money through a JustGiving page for St Peter's Food Ministries - they raised £1,850. This year thirteen members of our congregation took up the challenge to walk all or part of the 14 mile route and they raised £1,430. The picture below shows the group that started their walk at St Peter's Church. They are already planning St Peter's Parish Walk 2022!





Come to our Christingle on Christmas Eve

Last year our Christingle service was held online, but this year there will be two Christingle services at St Peter's Church on Christmas Eve at 3:00 pm and 4:30 pm. 

Alpha starts here in January 2022



We believe that everyone should have the chance to explore the Christian faith, ask questions and share their point of view. **Alpha** is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith. Each session looks at a different question around faith and is designed to create conversation.

Alpha is run around the globe and everyone's welcome. It runs in cafés, churches, universities, homes - you name it. No two Alphas look the same, but generally they have three things in common: food, a talk and good conversation.

The next Alpha course at St Peter's Church starts on Wednesday 19th January 2022 from 6:00 – 8:30 pm. Each session will start with a meal, because it's a great way to build community and get to know each other. Then there's a talk, around 30 minutes long, exploring the big issues around faith and unpacking the basics of Christianity. Followed by the most important part of any Alpha: the chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, and simply discuss it in a small group.
