## New muffles for St Peter's bells being dedicated today!

The bells are the greatest reminder in Harrogate of a living Church worshipping the living God. For anyone who hears them, their thoughts are turned God-wards, mostly with joy. We have many people in Harrogate who appreciate the sound and look forward to them ringing on a Friday night and on Sundays.

They are, of course, basically a reminder of the time that services are taking place, but they are also heralds of many other great occasions in the life of individuals and of the country. They celebrate weddings, anniversaries, births, birthdays, the changing of the year, cycle races, coronations and peace; they also mark deaths, remembrance and invasions. For the latter, the bells need to be muffled. Usually half muffled, but for really important occasions fully muffled.

We have only had half muffles up to now and as they became more worn, it became

harder to hear the contrast between the two strokes. So, at the beginning of lockdown, Andy Guthrie our Steeple Keeper, carefully measured all our clappers and ordered new ones from *Big Wilf*. Here they are in all their glory, and they sound wonderful.

But for all this we need ringers – up the tower this morning the total ringing experience of the ringers was nearly 200 years – built up from a few months to 62 years. Our ringers range from twelve year olds to people in their 80s. But without them the bells would be silent. It's a wonderful opportunity and responsibility to keep the bells ringing out their wonderful message.
