### Dying crops means food stops

This year's Christian Aid Week (11<sup>th</sup> -17<sup>th</sup> May) is focusing on Christian Aid's work in Guatemala, Central America, where the climate crisis is causing the seasons to intensify and shift erratically. As a result, farming communities have to battle devastating floods and intense heatwaves. Water sources are drying up and vital crops are failing, plunging farming families into hunger and poverty.

Amelia is a resourceful and determined 24-yearold farmer, and a mother of two, from the Alta Verapaz region. She said the situation is very worrying, "In the past three years, we've been experiencing high heat and a lack of rain. One of the biggest issues is the lack of water ... my plantations have been dying ... and there is no food for my family."

Despite the challenges families like Amelia's are facing, the unstoppable power of hope drives people to look for ways to push back. With training from Christian Aid's partner, Congcoop, Amelia's gaining the skills and knowledge to cultivate native seeds that are better suited to the changing climate. She's planning planting schedules that will deliver multiple harvests throughout the year, making her own organic fertilizer, and constructing rainwater collection systems.

Amelia's also a leader in her community, sharing her knowledge with other households, so that one day, no family will worry about their children going without food.

### Ripon Theatre Festival 1st - 6th July 2025



Henri Nouwen (1932–1996) was a Dutch Catholic priest and psychologist who reached the heights academic success before abandoning everything to join the community of L'Arche, in He became part of this life-sharing movement, seeking to make known the gifts of people with intellectual disabilities, exploring their unique talents and creating a welcoming home of friendship and belonging. A sought-after preacher and speaker, he also wrote about thirty-Tuesday 1st July, Ripon Cathedral, 7.30pm five widely read books on the spiritual life.

On the opening night of this year's Ripon Theatre Festival there will be a performance of **The Beloved Son**, a play inspired by the life of Henri Nouwen, in Ripon Cathedral. In preparation for this performance, Ripon Cathedral will be hosting two evening discussion groups to explore the life, core themes and writings of Henri Nouwen, led by the Revd Dr Rod Allon-Smith and his wife, Jan. Both Discovering Nouwen groups will take place at Thorpe Prebend House.
