Your Giving Counts

One of the things I love about St Peter's is that it is a community of participants rather than passengers. An extraordinarily high proportion of our worshipping community is engaged, in one way or another, in a vast range of different acts of service — in ways that fit with their health, time of life, family circumstances, working hours, skills and experience. From praying daily to cleaning the church weekly; from serving coffee to preparing the building for worship; from serving on the church council to counting gift aid envelopes. The list is endless. All these contributions combine to create a worshipping community of Jesus-followers that is open to everyone, generous with time and resources, and engaged with the needs of others. All this is possible because we are a community of participants — a place where every contribution counts.

The same is true with our financial giving. In recent years, however, our financial giving has not kept up with our costs. As a result, we now face a deficit for 2025 of more than £100,000. In previous years this underlying deficit has been masked by large legacies and a series of very generous one-off donations. These exceptional gifts have enabled us, up until now, to more than pay our way. But not this year. This year we face the prospect of having to ask other churches to help pay for our clergy — where previously this has always been the other way around.

St Peter's is unusual in terms of the range of people's financial resources. Some of our members are among the poorest in North Yorkshire, while others are among the wealthiest. This makes it especially important that each one of us listens to what God has to say to us about our giving – this is not a time to compare ourselves with the person sitting next to us. At the same time, I hope it is helpful to explain that, to meet our costs and obligations, we need average weekly donations of £20 per week per adult. At present that average is £14.51 per adult.

I conclude with a thank you and a please. Thank you for everything you have given, in acts of service and in financial giving, to enable St Peter's to stand at the centre of the town's commercial district and witness to a different set of values – the values of Jesus. (continued overleaf)



Dame Sarah Mullally named as the next Archbishop of Canterbury



On 3rd October 2025, Downing Street announced that the Rt Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally would become the next Archbishop of Canterbury, in succession to Justin Welby; as such she will be Primate of All England and the metropolitan bishop of the Province of Canterbury. She will be the first woman to hold the post. Her election by the College of Canons is expected before Christmas, with legal confirmation at St Paul's

Cathedral on 28th January 2026. She will then be formally installed at Canterbury Cathedral in March, marking the start of her ministry as Archbishop of Canterbury. Born in Woking in 1962, Bishop Sarah became a Christian at the age of 16. Before being ordained, Bishop Sarah worked as a nurse in the National Health Service, where she specialised as a cancer nurse and, at the age of 37, became the Government's Chief Nursing Officer for England, the youngest person ever to be appointed to the post. Bishop Sarah was made a Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire in recognition of her outstanding contribution to nursing.

She was ordained in 2001 and served her curacy in the Diocese of Southwark, initially as a self-supporting minister, before leaving her government post in 2004. In 2012, she was installed as Canon Treasurer at Salisbury Cathedral and three years later took the role as Suffragan Bishop of Crediton in the Diocese of Exeter. On 12th May 2018, Bishop Sarah was installed as the 133rd Bishop of London at St Paul's Cathedral, the first woman to hold the role. Bishop Sarah is married to Eamonn, and they have two grown-up children, Liam and Grace.
