Living in Love and Faith – Identity

Living in Love and Faith is about celebrating God's gift to us of life, relationships and sexuality. The Bible has a joyful vision of God's purposes for human life and the more we understand this, the more we should want to receive it afresh ourselves.

As we approach this, we need to acknowledge our fears as we share with one another, learning to trust one another. It may be that we're afraid to listen to or hear about someone who is different from us. We might be afraid that we won't know what to say or how to respond. We may be afraid of approving of something that we might think is wrong.

Many LGBTI+ people experience fear because their identity or sexuality is met with hostility or rejection. This occurs within church communities as well as in wider society, with disagreement about how sexual orientation and gender aspects of identity relate to our identity in Christ.

The opposite of fear is a feeling of confidence and safety. Thankfully, most of us have one or more people with whom we feel really safe because they know us and accept us as we are – affirming our identity. In our relationship with God, we trust in his acceptance as we all stand in need of God's mercy and grace. Our job is to



welcome one another just as Christ welcomed us.

I wonder how, as the community that is St Peter's Church we might learn to celebrate and affirm every person without discrimination.

'A Place at the Table' Lecture: Kitchen Visions of the First Christians 10:00 – 11:30 am, Saturday 9th April, St Peter's Church, Harrogate

Why did ordinary people in the First Century decide to follow Jesus? The message of salvation, death and resurrection was neither simple nor unchallenging. And yet, the church grew rapidly and showed remarkable resilience in the face of persecution. Why? One possible factor is the unique way the first Christians articulated Jesus' vision – through eating. As part of 'A Place at the Table', the Revd Dr Alan Garrow, Vicar of St Peter's Harrogate and Member of SIIBS at the University of Sheffield, explores the relationship between eating and Christian vision – and the implications for the way Christians eat and worship today.

Several individual members of St Peter's already support *Mission Possible*. While we are more familiar with their work in Rwanda, *Mission Possible* has also worked in the Odessa area of southern Ukraine for many years. It is feared that the city will soon be under attack. Many people are now fleeing Odessa.

The *Mission Possible* team is helping to transport refugees to the Moldovan border crossing. Also, they are providing

bedding, food, and spiritual and emotional support at the border. *Mission Possible* have also worked in the past few years in Moldova, so they have good contacts both sides of the border.

Mission Possible's Eastern European Director has sent this appeal to the office here in the UK: 'We need a lot of funds to help the needs of the refugees and also, if possible, to help in the villages where we have been working. Please raise everything you can.'
