On Sea Sunday meet a Lay Chaplain with the Mission to Seafarers



As a lay chaplain to ports, Ruth Campbell's area of care stretches from Southend to Silvertown in east London. It ranges from small jetties to the giant ports of London Gateway, where the container ships arrive, and London Tilbury.

Around 10,000 ships come up the River Thames every year – with cruise ships alone carrying up to 800 crew. Some stay only for five hours before

heading back out – and others up to a week while their ships are unloaded.

Many crew will have had little or no contact with their families over a nine month period with some having missed key family occasions and milestones. Ruth's role will very often mean carrying WiFi routers on board to help seafarers make contact with their families and friends. Where a ship is only in dock for a couple of hours, her team will help with requests such as a lift to a supermarket to stock up.

Her job is to provide a listening ear for seafarers who might want to talk about a range of issues from missing their families to their mental health or other areas such as pay and conditions. The crews — with Filipinos making up the biggest nationality - are deeply religious and she will arrange services and prayers where requested.

Ruth Campbell is a lay chaplain with <u>The Mission to Seafarers</u> - a Christian charity supporting the world's 1.89m merchant seafarers in over 260 ports worldwide. Today, Sunday 14th July, is designated as Sea Sunday when we are asked to remember and pray for seafarers and give thanks for their vital role in our lives, transporting 90% of the food, products and raw materials that we need.

St Swithun's Day if thou dost rain...



Tomorrow it is 15th July – St Swithun's Day. Legend has it that if it rains on St Swithun's Day then the wet weather will continue for 40 days:

St. Swithun's day if thou dost rain, For forty days it will remain, St. Swithun's day if thou be fair, For forty days 'twill rain nae mair.

St Swithun was the Bishop of Winchester in Saxon times. His dying wish was that he be buried in a simple grave outside by the door of the Saxon Minster and here he rested for over a hundred years; but in 971 the monks of Winchester decided to move his body to a more opulent shrine inside the Cathedral. The ceremony, on 15th July, was ruined by a huge downpour and so the legend started. His tomb became a major site for pilgrims hoping to be healed until the Reformation when it was destroyed. Let's hope Monday stays dry and fair, so that Summer can start at last!



The Seafarers' Hymn - Eternal Father, strong to save

'Eternal Father, Strong to Save' is a hymn traditionally associated with seafarers, particularly with the *Mission to Seafarers* and the Royal Navy. Written in 1860, its author, William Whiting, was inspired by Psalm 107, which describes the power and fury of the seas in great detail. John B Dykes, an Anglican clergyman, composed the tune 'Melita' to accompany the version that appeared in *Hymns Ancient & Modern* in 1861. It is sung at *Mission to Seafarers* services at port chapels all over the world.

Eternal Father, strong to save Whose arm hath bound the restless wave.

Who bid'st the mighty ocean deep Its own appointed limits keep; O hear us when we cry to Thee, For those in peril on the sea.

O Christ, Whose voice the waters heard


