SHINE is a community organisation based at St Stephen's Church in the heart of West Bowling, a suburb of Bradford in West Yorkshire. SHINE stands for **S**ocial, **H**ealth, **I**nner, **N**atural and **E**conomic wellbeing. They believe that people need to thrive in all these areas for a fulfilled life. SHINE is fully active, engaged and immersed in the community. With a 'hands on' approach to everything



they do, from *Pop Up Pantry* to *Gardening Club* and *Job Search* to *Creative Friends*, there are lots of different ways for local people to get involved. Their activities and projects help over 200 men, women and children every single week.

The goal of SHINE is to create a vibrant, community hub that reaches the socially excluded, brings the community together, and delivers a wide range of life-enhancing services and opportunities to people of all ages, faiths and ethnicities.

# The High Sheriff of North Yorkshire visits St Peter's Breakfast Club

The Office of High Sheriff is an independent non-political Royal appointment for a single year. Sir Andrew was sworn into office in a ceremony at York Crown Court in April. The origins of the Office date back to Saxon times, when the 'Shire Reeve' was responsible to the king for the maintenance of law and order within the shire, or county, and for the collection and return of taxes due to the Crown. Today, they still support those involved in the administration of justice, including the judiciary, the police and the prison service, as well as supporting local charities. There are 55 High Sheriffs serving the counties of England and Wales; they receive no remuneration and no part of the expense of a High Sheriff's year falls on the public purse.

# **Banns of Marriage**




The banns of marriage are published between Laura Elizabeth Drummond Gessey and Jonathan Rex Binder.
