More than 102,562 children are sponsored and cared for by 418 **Compassion UK** church partners in Rwanda. Many members of St Peter's sponsor a child there.



Due to COVID-19 restrictions, eleven-year-old Brenda is one of many children unable to go to her school or her **Compassion** programmes. Thankfully, the Rwandan National Office came up with the brilliant idea of airing the **Compassion** curriculum on national radio in the form of a drama series! The series is called *Ikirezi*, which is loosely translated as 'a precious pearl'.

Brenda is one of the thousands of children who've not missed a single episode. Hassan, the Partnership Facilitator, says, "Besides sponsored children, other Rwandan children are benefiting from the contents of the *Ikirezi* drama series. Because many children listen to the programme, so the character of many Rwandan children is being shaped."

## You called and we came

Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2021 will mark the fourth national Windrush Day and 73 years since the SS Empire Windrush arrived at Tilbury Docks in 1948 carrying the first Caribbean migrants to the UK to help rebuild Britain after the Second World War.

Many nurses and midwives were invited by the British Government to come to Britain and help staff the newly formed National Health Service. However, no preparation had been made to receive them and the British people themselves were unprepared for the influx of large numbers of migrants. As a result, far from the welcome they expected, these nurses and midwives were introduced into a largely hostile social and work environment. There are many stories of the challenges faced by black people of the Windrush generation – experiences of racism, isolation and rejection as they tried to fulfil the duties they were assigned. Many found that their qualifications from the Caribbean were not validated in the UK and had to work twice as hard to 'regain' the recognition and professional levels they arrived with. ## Help Amnesty end the brutal repression of the Uyghurs in China

Since 2017, an estimated million people of predominantly Muslim ethnic minorities have been arbitrarily detained in Xinjiang. Under the guise of fighting 'terrorism', men and women from Muslim ethnic minorities like Uyghurs and Kazakhs have been targeted.



Former detainees and their families describe how charity work, international travel or sending money to loved ones abroad have been the triggers for their detention in the camps. The brutal repression of these communities amounts to crimes against humanity of imprisonment, torture and persecution. **You can add your voice to Amnesty's petition calling on the Chinese authorities to immediately release everyone arbitrarily detained and reunite them with their families** by visiting [www.amnesty.org.uk/actions/help-end-repression-uyghurs-china](http://www.amnesty.org.uk/actions/help-end-repression-uyghurs-china).
