## ASDA are no longer donating food to St Peter's Food Ministry

Hannah Beck wants to let everyone, who uses the ASDA food donation trolley in their store, know that ASDA are no longer supporting St Peter's Food Ministry. She understands that several members of our congregation donate food using the instore trolley when they do their weekly shop, so they don't have to carry their donations home and then bring them to Church.

ASDA are now supporting *Resurrected Bites*' Community Groceries scheme, which many of the people who come to St Peter's 'mini supermarket' on Thursdays don't use. So if you want to continue supporting St Peter's – the Breakfast Club, weekday hot meals, Sunday lunches and Thursday 'mini supermarket' - please bring any food or other donations to Church and put them in the wicker basket by the West doors.

- **Food**: tinned meat, fish, vegetables or fruit; breakfast cereals; biscuits; jars of jam, honey or peanut butter; pasta sauce; instant coffee or teabags; long-life juice, pouches of pre-cooked rice; dried fruit; treats like sweets, chocolate or cake!
- **Toiletries**: deodorant, toilet paper, shower gel, shaving gel, shampoo, soap, toothbrushes, tooth paste, hand wipes.
