Hot food is available 4:30 – 4:50 pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.


Our mini Supermarket is on Thursdays 4:30 – 4:50 pm.

Choral Evensong returns to St Peter's next Sunday

As an English language service, Evensong dates back to the time of the Reformation; a combination of the old monastic offices of Vespers and Compline marking the passing of the day. The liturgy that we use in Church was first laid out in Cranmer's Book of Common Prayer of 1549 and some of the poetical language survives to this day. The music took shape a few decades later, in the reign of Elizabeth I, with great composers like William Byrd and Thomas Tallis developing exquisite choral music specifically for this new service, and in each subsequent generation composers have been inspired to write their own settings for the responses and canticles.

Evensong starts with a sung set of responses - O Lord, open our lips; and our mouth shall show forth thy praise - and continues through a psalm, a set of canticles (the Magnificat and the Nunc Dimittis) and two short readings, further chanted responses and prayers (including the Lord's Prayer), a choral anthem, and concludes with a set of prayers reflecting current events or concerns.

At St Peter's, Choral Evensong takes place at 6:30 pm on Sundays and is sung by our accomplished choir. The service is accompanied by St Peter's impressive organ played splendidly by our Director of Music, John Longstaff. Choral Evensong is a beautiful tradition just waiting to be experienced that can give respite, peace and inspiration at the end of the day – why not come along and try it?
