

2025 - 2026 - The Year of John

Have you ever noticed how often (or how seldom) readings from John's Gospel crop up in our Sunday worship? The pattern of readings used by the Church of England since 2000 uses a three-year cycle: The Year of Matthew, The Year of Mark, and The Year of Luke (which is where we are currently), and then back to Matthew. John's Gospel does crop up, often around festivals, but it doesn't provide the underlying narrative.

John's Gospel tells the same basic story as the other three Gospels, but it does so in a very different way. Some individual episodes overlap but many others do not. It's style, tone and theology are also distinctively different. There is something to be said, therefore, for seeing what happens when we give attention to following Jesus through the eyes of John's Gospel.

This is why, starting from Advent 2025, we will be following a pattern of Bible readings that focusses on a John's-eye-view. There will also be other John-related events in 2026, such as a performance, in Holy Week, of Bach's St John Passion; the publication, in June, of a newly recovered Johannine text; and, in February, a *Harrogate School of Theology and Mission* Seminar introducing the remarkable commentary that has inspired this experimental 'Year of John':



16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence

From 25th November to 10th December, Ripon Cathedral will mark the international *16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence* campaign. Working with *White Ribbon UK, New Beginnings* and *The Mothers' Union*, the Cathedral will host a series of events to raise awareness and inspire change. These include an art exhibition launch on 25th November and a silent vigil from 10:00 am on 6th December followed by a *Service of Lament and Hope*. All are welcome to come and show support.

Weaving Stories - a Bradford 2025 Project

Shaeron Caton Rose is working on a heritage project with Bradford Cathedral and SHINE, one of our partner charities. Two tapestry looms have been set up, one at

the Cathedral (seen here) and one at St Stephen's Church, West Bowling, where SHINE is based. Bradford Guild of Weavers, Spinners and Dyers have spun and dyed local wool using local natural dyes, which is being used to create the tapestry. Anyone is welcome to weave a few lines of weft onto which felted imagery will be sewn reflecting the lives of



the people of Bradford. The finished piece will be unveiled on St Blaise's Day - the patron saint of wool weavers — 3rd February 2026 at the Cathedral. The *SHINE* loom has suffered from technical problems and has had to be completely re-warped. With the deadline for completion looming (excuse the pun!), Shaeron is looking for willing volunteers to help to complete this tapestry. Would you have the time to travel to St Stephen's in Bradford and help? Instructions are provided, and there are staff there to help you. If you need to know more email Shaeron at shaeron@mac.com.
