

## St Peter's Fuel Poverty Grants – the deadline is TODAY!





After World War II Albania became a Communist state, ruled by dictator Enver Hoxha (*right*) until his death in 1985. During this time Albania was cut off from the rest of the world – travelling abroad, Western clothes and music and all religions were banned; the state controlled all media; and tens of thousands of perceived 'dissidents' were imprisoned in forced labour camps or executed. 

## St Wilfrid's Procession returns to the streets of Ripon

After being postponed for two years, Ripon's traditional St Wilfrid's procession will be back this summer from 1:45 – 4:30 pm on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> July. Held in honour of the city's patron saint, St Wilfrid, the procession around Ripon dates back to 1108 when King Henry I granted a charter to the City to hold an annual fair each year around this time.



Many local organisations enter floats and there are usually marching bands and Morris dancers, all led by St Wilfrid on his horse. Ripon Cathedral will be taking part, trundling their enormous Wilfra Tart on wheels through the streets and handing out Wilfra tarts to the crowd. 
