The Season of Creationtide has its origins in the Eastern Orthodox Church, which in 1989 declared 1st September as a day of prayer for creation. Over the following decades, as awareness of the present ecological challenges facing our world grew, this single day of prayer developed into a liturgical season running from 1st September to 4th October, the feast day of St Francis of Assisi. This season of Creationtide has been embraced by the leaders of the Anglican, Catholic and Orthodox churches, as well as by several major ecumenical groups including the World Council of Churches. During Creationtide Christians around the world are encouraged to pray for, and care for, God's good creation.

As we journey towards our Harvest Celebrations on Sunday 2nd October, we take this particular opportunity, in the remaining Sundays of the Season, to seek God's mercy and guidance as we reckon with the challenges that lie ahead. A challenge likely to be uppermost for all of us is that of heating. Here at St Peter's, as well as in our homes and workplaces, we have tough choices to make for the immediate, as well as the longer-term future.

Living God, you call us to be good stewards of this earthly home, strengthen us to care for your creation; forgive us when, through our greed and indifference we abuse its beauty and damage its potential. Empower us, through your Spirit to so nurture and love the world, that all creation sings to your glory. Amen

St Peter's Bellringers mark the death of Her Majesty The Queen

Within minutes of the announcement of the death of Her Majesty, The Queen, the (bell) wheels were in motion for a first for St Peter's; ringing for the death of a monarch, as our bells were installed in 1963, one decade into The Queen's reign. As with many aspects of Operation London Bridge the ringing of bells over the mourning period was complicated. Tradition dictates that the bells are rung 'fully muffled' for the death of a monarch, where a leather pad is attached to both sides of the clapper (one side in the case of the tenor bell).

So on the evening of 8th September a team was up in the belfry, climbing through the bell frame to fit the muffles. The bells were then rung at noon the following day for one hour, along with bells all around the country. After the proclamation of King Charles III the next day, the muffles were removed to ring 'open' to celebrate his accession. The muffles then went back on for the remainder of the mourning period, so the ringing last Sunday was fully muffled.



The bells were rung once again for the hour preceding the State Funeral and during the last 10 minutes of that hour the tenor bell tolled 96 times to represent the age of The Queen.
