

Listening to God through Scripture

One of the most important ways we grow in faith is by engaging with Scripture. When we open the Bible, we are not just reading words on a page, we are hearing the living Word of God.



Some people can feel a little daunted by the Bible, worried it might be too difficult or confusing. But we don't need to be afraid of Scripture. The Bible is like a treasure chest, full of wisdom, comfort, guidance, and hope. Each time we open it, we discover more of God's riches and His love for us.

There are many ways to connect with Scripture. Some enjoy setting aside quiet moments to read and reflect; others find it helpful to listen, pray, or discuss the Bible with friends. The key is to find a rhythm that helps you hear God's voice and draws you closer to Him.

As a Church, we offer spaces for this, groups for discussion and exploration, and our online Morning and Evening Prayer, live streamed daily on our Facebook page. You might also find digital tools helpful. A few excellent options include:



We commemorate All Souls with a memorial service here next Sunday at 6:30 pm, which is dedicated to those who have lost a loved one or special friend. This service is an opportunity to light a candle, reflect and give thanks for the life so dear to us that was lost.

Petition to keep the promised settlement route for BNO visa holders

Many Hongkongers on the British National Overseas visa have started a new life in the UK after the imposition of the National Security Law in Hong Kong. They followed the rules with the understanding that after five years, they could settle permanently if they met the English and civic knowledge requirements. The proposed Immigration White Paper changes this, and it will affect the Hongkongers who attend our Church.

The petition declares that altering the 5+1 settlement route for British National Overseas (BNO) passport holders, which currently allows them to apply for Indefinite Leave to Remain (ILR) after 5 years and citizenship a year after that, but would likely be changed to 10 years under current plans, would be an unfair change on a community of nearly 150,000 people who have made the UK their home following China's imposition of a National Security Law on Hong Kong in 2020, and are largely expecting to become eligible for indefinite leave within the next year; and further declares that the changes will severely disrupt the dignity and stability of this group of people who are subject to transnational repression from China.

The petitioners therefore request that the House of Commons urge the Government to change course and keep the current 5+1 settlement route in place for those British National (Overseas) visa holders already residing in the UK, to ensure that they can continue to settle into their new lives in the UK.
