From extreme sadness to utter joy

One of the joys of being Director of Music here at St. Peter's is the opportunity to direct occasional concerts and a week on Friday, on **8th October at 7:15 pm**, exactly 18 months after we had originally hoped, St. Peter's Choir joins again with Vocalis for **Bach's Mass in B minor**. Although we cannot truly say that things are now back to normal, at least we're getting there, and it's great to have the opportunity to celebrate



being able to make music together again in the presence of a live audience. The B minor Mass is an extended setting (in Latin) of the familiar words of the Communion Service. As well as the five vocal soloists (Aoife O'Connell, Emma Kirkby DBE, Emma Stannard, James Micklethwaite and Andrew Greenan) there are extensive solos for the orchestra too, in particular for the flute, oboe d'amore (a deeper than usual oboe, but not quite as low as the cor anglais), solo horn and solo violin. Bach's exuberant writing for three trumpets and timpani is also an exciting feature of this wonderful work, which explores the whole gamut of human emotions ranging from extreme sadness to utter joy. The twenty-two professional members of the Harrogate Bach Players will be led by Fiona Love, with organist Alan Horsey. Praying for the UN Climate Change Conference – COP26 Goal Three



To deliver on the first two goals, developed countries must make good on their promise to **mobilise at least \$100bn in climate finance** per year by 2020.

International financial institutions must play their part and we need work towards unleashing the trillions in private and public sector finance required to secure global net zero.

We pray for a massive breakthrough to emerge during COP26 from richer countries, to make the necessary finances available for poorer countries so they can mobilise adaptation and mitigation programmes. Such a breakthrough is even tougher when Covid-19 has caused huge economic impact – and yet without it, all our futures, and in particular the futures of all those living in poorer countries, are precarious.
