

- Lifted to new heights of emotion through wonderful worship music. Concerts
 £20 per event.
- A place where I can enjoy my favourite hobby, bellringing. Change hobby –
 join Choir £163 pa; Golf Club £400 pa, Bowls £60 pa; Gym £60 pcm.
- A place where I can do what I feel God wants me to do, Feeding Hungry People.
 Single town centre floor premise, to run a café at least £2,000 pcm.
- A place where I know that others can come to seek God, reassurance, hope, just because it is here. Unmeasurable.

In monetary terms, I could never afford to pay all that the Church is worth to me. But what I can do is pay as much as I possibly can, knowing the value that the Church means to me and thanking God for the building and the people.
