

# Walking together through Holy Week

Each day of Holy Week there are three, four or even five opportunities to join with others as we journey together following Jesus towards the Cross.



As well as Morning and Evening each dav, Praver and Holy Communion at 11:00 am on Thursday. there will also be: Compline at 9:00 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday; a broadcast of the 2019 recording of the St Matthew Passion at 7:15 pm on Wednesday; Choral Communion at 7:30 pm on Maundy Thursday; a Family Service at 10:00 am and at 2:00 pm An Hour before the Cross, both on Good Friday.

Details of these services and how to book (where necessary) are available inside this newsletter, on the website and on the back of the St Peter's Easter Card.

There is something particularly worthwhile about engaging with Jesus' journey to the Cross every day in Holy Week – whether with others or alone. It makes Easter all the more meaningful and joyful when it comes.

## Make a Palm Cross for Palm Sunday



Palm Sunday is the last Sunday before Easter and signifies the start of Holy Week in the church calendar. The story of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem is told in Matthew 21 v 1 - 11. As Jesus rode a donkey into the city, a large crowd gathered and spread palm branches and their cloaks on the road. The hundreds of people shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

Many churches celebrate Palm Sunday with the waving of palm branches, singing traditional hymns, and making

crosses out of palm leaves. The palm crosses are blessed and taken home by the members of the congregation and some of the crosses may be burned the following year to use as the ashes for Ash Wednesday.


**Hot food** to eat in (with distanced seating) or take away, available 4:30 – 4:50 pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.



The UK's top supermarkets will not be stocking The Real Easter Egg in 2021. The start of the pandemic led to the supermarkets having a disastrous Easter 2020 as people stayed away from high streets. This year, supermarket buyers were told to cut brands. It means there will be fewer brands, including The Real Easter Egg, on their shelves this Easter.
