## Dedication of the new liturgical textiles

Today is Advent Sunday and St. Peter's is celebrating the new liturgical textiles which you can see here and on the next page. The project to replace these textiles began in 2019 when a Commissioning Group was set up. One set of liturgical textiles comprises of the altar frontal, pulpit fall, clergy stole, burse and veil. They mark the changing seasons of the Church's year and express the visions and values of St. Peter's.





The Group decided to replace the set used for Advent and Lent, and after a selection process commissioned Polly Meynell. Polly is an ecclesiastical textile designer and examples of her work can be seen in both Bradford and Guildford Cathedrals and in St. Andrew's Church, Corbridge. She has also designed and created vestments for the Bishops of Gloucester, Leeds, London and Stockport.

The design of the new set of textiles uses the sacrament as the central theme; the sacrament is broken into pieces to feed the people. The red and pink segments are representative of the body and blood and between them the blue is for the Virgin Mary and her central role in carrying and nurturing the Christ Child. The blue is pierced with a vertical shard of gold putting God at the heart and the horizontal gold bar links the body and blood with Mary's mantle. The green segment and small vertical section represent the vine and are the connecting feature between the sacrament and the background. Polly has used sustainable textiles sourced from within Yorkshire. We are most grateful to the sponsors of this project.

The designer, Polly Meynell, came to St Peter's to install the new altar frontal earlier in November. Polly stretched and attached the embroidered panel carefully to its specially made frame, then mitred and stitched the corners. Magnets are used to hold it in place on the front of the altar. Below you can see a close-up of the central motif, and the Vicar, Alan Garrow, wearing one of the three new stoles and the new burse and veil in their place on the altar.



## The first day of Advent and of a new church year



Today is the first day of Advent and the beginning of the new Liturgical year – 2021 is Year C in the three-year cycle of readings. We will be lighting the first candle on our Advent wreath, which is purple and symbolizes **HOPE**. Three of the candles are purple, because it is the liturgical colour for Advent that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The new altar textiles have purple as their main colour and will be used for both Advent and Lent.


