

A new Area Dean for the Harrogate Deanery

The Bishop of Leeds has invited me to serve as Area Dean for the Harrogate Deanery. I begin in this role from 1st January 2022.

There are six area deans who work with the Area Bishop, The Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley, and the Archdeacon, The Ven Jonathan Gough, to care for the clergy and parishes in the Ripon Episcopal Area. Harrogate Deanery covers Harrogate, Knaresborough, Starbeck, Wetherby and surrounding villages.

My role will be to help order and support mission and ministry these churches. amongst representing the local situation in wider conversations about planning, policy, and deployment. I will also have a role in supporting local parishes as they transition between clergy.

Although this change is bound to have an impact on how we organise



ourselves here at St Peter's, it is important to emphasize that being Vicar here remains my principal responsibility. I am extraordinarily fortunate to be part of a local church with so many faithful, capable and committed members. Thank you so much for your support in the past. Your continuing support will surely be invaluable as I start to take up this new challenge.

The observance of Plough Sunday in its present form goes back to Victorian times, but behind it there is a much older observance, associated with the first working day after the twelve days of Christmas.
