Lifting Lockdown

As things currently stand 'freedom day' is Monday 19th July. From that date we plan to restore as much of our previous activity as possible. Between now and the end of August, our plan is to include:

Tuesdays from 20th July:

12:00 – 12:30 pm Healing Service – weekly, no booking required

Wednesdays from 21st July

10:30 – 11:00 am Wednesday Reflexions – weekly, no booking required **Thursdays** – as presently

9:30 – 11:00 am Toddlers – weekly, no booking required

11:00 – 11:30 am Holy Communion – weekly, no booking required

Sundays from 25th July

8:30 – 8:55 am Holy Communion (BCP) – weekly, no booking required

9:30 – 10:20 am Family Communion – weekly, no booking, no Sunday Club at present 11:00 – 11:55 am Choral Matins/Choral Communion – weekly, no booking required

The next **Afternoon Church** will be at 4:15pm on Sunday 11th July – booking still required. For details for future dates see next week's *Weekly News*.

The next **Evensong** will be at 6:30pm on Sunday 25th July – no booking required. Further dates will be decided once we have more guidance on singing and choir sizes.

Some questions, of course, remain. From 20th July onwards: will we be allowed to sing; will masks still be required; will refreshments be possible; can we receive bread and wine at Holy Communion? We don't know the answers to these just yet. We will, however, restore everything we can as soon as we can, so far as Government and Diocesan advice allows.

What about Sunday Club, Refreshment Days, Thursday Reflexions, a daily open building from 9:00 am – 5:15 pm, study groups and social groups? Our hope is that it will be possible to bring these back in September. We expect that volunteer capacity, rather than Covid restrictions, will be the determining factor in these cases – so your help is absolutely vital here. In the next few weeks, please look out for information about where there is a need for new, as well as returning, volunteers. (*continued overleaf*)

A big **thank you** to everyone who has worked to sustain our worship, service and pastoral care to this point. As we enter this next stage of transition, may God shape us into a body of Christ that is ready to respond with insight and joy to the needs and challenges of our new context.
