Today we mark Hannah's unique contribution and the passing of the baton of Tower Master to Michelle Anderson. The Bellringers' Hymn (by Henry Charles Wilder, 1904)



Being the Body of Christ: How can we include people living with invisible illnesses and chronic conditions in our church communities? – a seminar by Dr Penny Pullan



The Bishop of Leeds announces his retirement



The Rt Revd Nick Baines, Bishop of Leeds, announced that he is retiring at the end of November. In 2014, the dioceses of Bradford, Ripon & Leeds, and Wakefield were dissolved and the new diocese of Leeds was created, led by Bishop Nick. The Bishop of Bradford, Toby Howarth, will take over his duties from September. Bishop Nick will officiate for the last time at Bradford and Wakefield Cathedrals on 19th and 26th October. His farewell service will take place at 3:30 pm on Sunday 23rd November at Ripon Cathedral after which he will retire to Liverpool with his wife, Linda.
