Creationtide begins ...

The Church of England has committed to aim for Net Zero Carbon Emissions by 2030 - their Environment Mission Statement says, 'Responding to the climate crisis is an essential part of our responsibility to safeguard God's creation and achieve a just world.'

The C of E has teamed up with A ROCHA UK (a Christian conservation charity) to introduce awards (bronze, silver and gold) for churches trying hard to raise awareness; tackle climate change; and strive for Net Zero emissions as far as possible. Respecting and caring for the natural world is at the forefront of our thoughts and actions during this season of *Creationtide*.

Here, at St Peter's, the Eco Church Group is trying to encourage us to engage with nature; consider our actions regarding energy usage; and cut down on our use of fossil fuels. Many of us took part in the Big Butterfly Count in August and in September we are going to plant wildflower seeds in the garden around St Peter's to encourage wildlife in the heart of Harrogate.



Also, it is 'Zero Emissions Day' on Sunday 21st September, and we hope as many of the congregation as possible will walk or cycle to Church on that day, or at least try to car share? Further initiatives will be announced through the year, but in this season of *Creationtide* particularly, we hope that you will all join us in trying to respect God's creation through our actions as well as our prayers.

The Whispering Forest exhibition in the Glass Foyer

Robert Harris has been an amateur photographer since the late 1970s and has lived in Harrogate since the early 1990s. During this period, he has witnessed the shift from film to digital, with the darkroom being replaced by the computer screen.

Upon retiring, he decided to pursue a degree in photography through the Open College of Arts, now part of the Open University. *The Whispering Forest* exhibition marks the culmination of his work for his photography degree. His work examines New Zealand's rainforest in a style unique to him; the prints depict the rainforest as shadows, tones, and lines, with the background simplified to mere shadows and highlights. Helen Watkinson, an established local poet, collaborated by adding short verses to some of prints. The exhibition is open in the Glass Foyer for one week commencing on 8th September 2025.

Harrogate School of Theology & Mission

David Ford OBE, Regius Professor of Divinity Emeritus at the University of Cambridge and a Fellow of Selwyn College., speaks on 'St. John's Gospel: A Lifetime's Study'



After spending over twenty years on 'The Gospel of John. A Theological Commentary' (2021) and then a few more years on a follow-up Lent book, 'Meeting God in John: A Companion for Lent, Holy Week, Easter, and Beyond' (2025), I want to share some of the main insights that John has given me. These include seeking answers to questions such as: What was John's aim in writing the Gospel? What are the essential Christian practices taught by Jesus? How should we read John now?

The Breakfast Club provides a free, hot breakfast every morning from Monday to Saturday (8:15 – 8:45 am) for all those who are hungry or in need.


Our mini-supermarket is on Thursdays from 4:20 – 4:40 pm – an opportunity to stock up on tinned, preserved and dried food and toiletries.


Wilfrid and His World: a two-part lecture series at Ripon Cathedral






Refreshments are served after each of our Sunday morning services from
