Could you serve on the Parochial Church Council?

Our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) takes place on **24th May at 7:00pm at St Peter's Church**. One thing we do at that meeting is elect new members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC). The PCC is the key decision-making body in the life of the church. It consists of clergy, churchwardens and others elected by the APCM. It is responsible for sharing the leadership, management and administration of a parish with the Vicar. To find out more about what it means to be a member of the PCC, and to see minutes of our previous meetings, visit the [Parochial Church Council \(PCC\) page](#) of the Church website.

To stand for election to the PCC you need to be an actual communicant, aged 16 or over, and not disqualified (e.g. by conviction of certain offences, disqualification as a company director or entry on a 'barred list'), and must be on the Church Electoral Roll (and, unless under 18, have been on the roll for at least 6 months). We will have space for eleven new elected council members and one Deanery Synod representative. If you would like to find out more, then do talk with one of the Clergy, Churchwardens or existing members of the PCC. The nomination forms are now available at the Welcome Desk and can also be downloaded from the [PCC page](#) of the Church website.

A healthy PCC is vital to the stability and vigour of the local church. If you have relevant experience, or you are involved in an aspect of Church life that is currently under-represented, please do consider standing.

Janet Zirugo: a grandmother who transformed her barren land into a garden of plenty

Our planet is changing, but some people are feeling the effects of these changes more than others. Weather extremes are now more frequent and more intense, and the world is facing a climate crisis. One country that is on the frontlines of this crisis is Zimbabwe. In rural Zimbabwe, seven out of ten women rely on farming to earn a living and provide for their families.

One woman who has faced the worst of the climate crisis is Janet Zirugo, a grandmother from Zimbabwe. She remembers the year the rains did not come and there was a severe drought that pushed her family into desperate hunger.

Working with Christian Aid, Janet learned about drought-tolerant crops, how to water plants in the dry season and her family built a storeroom to preserve food so they have the resilience to bounce back from future droughts. Now Janet's life is transformed, with the support of Christian Aid, she was able to bring her family through a painful time and turn her barren land into a garden of plenty.

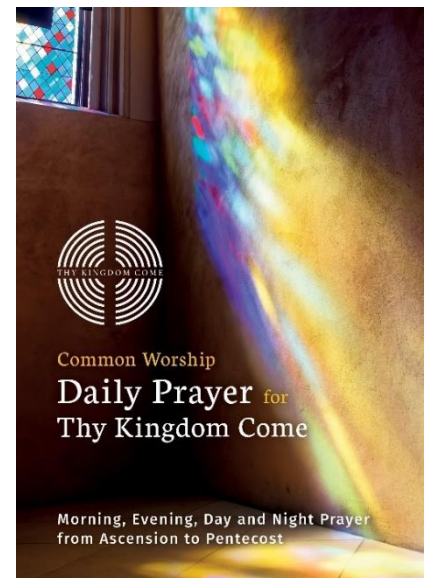
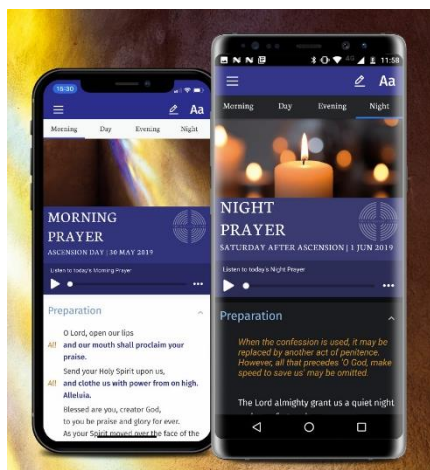
Daily Prayer for Thy Kingdom Come

Thy Kingdom Come is a global prayer movement inviting Christians to pray for the eleven days between Ascension Day and Pentecost.

The *Daily Prayer for Thy Kingdom Come* booklet offers Morning, Evening, Day and Night Prayer material taken from Common Worship, and is an ideal introduction to the rhythms and benefits of praying regularly.

There is also a free App to download for [iOS](#) and [Android](#) which has the services, psalms and readings from the booklet.

From Ascension Day (26th May), you can also [get Alexa and Google Home](#) to 'Ask the Church of England for today's Thy Kingdom Come' to hear a short service of Prayer During the Day (before 7:00 pm) and Night Prayer (after 7:00 pm) throughout the 11 days.



A novena is an ancient tradition of devotional praying in Christianity, with prayers repeated for nine successive days. The 2022 *Thy Kingdom Come Novena* has daily readings from the book of 1 Peter, with reflections written by Archbishop Justin Welby, and linoprint illustrations by Anna Heslop.
