Wilfred Owen (1893 – 1918)



British poet, Wilfrid Owen, was an officer in the First World War. After service on the Western Front, he was diagnosed with 'shell shock' and sent home. He returned to France and was awarded the Military Cross in 1918. He was killed in action on 4th November, just a few days before the Armistice. He was just 25 years old.



'Gassed' is a painting completed in 1919 by John Singer Sargent after he visited the Western Front. It depicts the aftermath of a mustard gas attack, with a line of blinded, wounded soldiers walking towards a dressing station, surrounded by many more dead or wounded soldiers.


The Market Day Café is on Thursday

breakfast and refreshments. Zoom live stream is £5 per person and must be purchased online in advance. Visit https://hstm.org.uk to book.




